Lesson 5 – The Holy Spirit

INTRODUCTION

Over the past few weeks we've considered some principles that help us grow our relationship with Jesus Christ. Another important aspect of a growing relationship with Jesus Christ is a proper understanding of the Holy Spirit. This lesson will help us understand the role of the Holy Spirit and how we relate to Him.

WHO IS THE HOLY SPIRIT?

There is a lot of confusion and misunderstanding about the Holy Spirit. Read the following verses and identify who the Holy Spirit is according to the Scriptures.

Act 5:1-4

Genesis 1:1-2

John 3:5-8

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity. He is as much God as the Father and the Son. He was active in creation and in our salvation.

WHERE IS THE HOLY SPIRIT?

Before returning to heaven, Jesus promised the disciples He would not leave them alone but would send the Holy Spirit. Read the following verses and identify where He resides.

John 14:16, 17

1 Corinthians 6:19

Ephesians 1:13, 14

Romans 8:16

When we call on Jesus Christ to be the forgiver of our sins and leader of our life, the Holy Spirit takes up residency in our physical body. After we're saved, the Holy Spirit confirms and assures us that we have become children of God.

Without the Holy Spirit, it is impossible to fully develop our relationship with Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit is waiting to teach us, guide us into truth, empower us to tell others about a relationship with Jesus Christ, strengthen us, lead us away from sinful choices, help us in our weaknesses, comfort us, give us spiritual gifts to serve others and produce in us the character qualities of Jesus Christ.

CONCLUSION

In Ephesians 5:18, the apostle Paul instructs us to *be filled with the Spirit*. Being filled with the Spirit is NOT us getting more of the Holy Spirit. We received ALL of Him the moment we trusted Jesus Christ as Savior. Being filled with the Spirit is the Holy Spirit getting MORE of us! It's a lifelong process of surrendering control to Jesus Christ and being supernaturally transformed into His likeness.
